Planning & Zoning

- Gayle will be attending at a later meeting to share progress regarding the property at the corner of Riverside and I-35.
- Discussion regarding SRCC supporting other neighborhoods in their struggles with

issues that affect them.

- Developers for the Woodward property (known as Sachem) has agreed to maintain a 100-foot setback from the creek. As a result, the Planning & Zoning chair proposes that we accept the requested plan to change the development from apartments to townhouses.
- In addition to the creek, neighbors who reside near to the property are concerned about being surrounded by apartments and unsavory activities. There is hope that units become home- owner residences, there will be less vandalism and crime.

Mobility

A2025 public survey revealed mostly negative feedback to the City regarding the current RPP program. The city is revising the program and has proposed the following changes.

- Commercially signed vehicles can park for 30 minutes free.
- 45 day parking permits for purchase by construction workers. a maximum of three passes per site. These are for personal trucks without commercial markings.
- Residency requirements to be more strict and cars must be registered to permit address. Initiates a sanctioning and/or revocation process for permit abuse and underutilization of resident reserved spaces.
- There was further discussion of RPPs by attendees.

Public Safety

- An analysis of crime reports show that in the 78704 zip code for the month of May, the most frequent crimes reported were criminal trespass (45), crash leaving the scene (35); and criminal mischief (30), followed closely by vehicle burglary, auto theft and mail theft, theft of license plate and bicycle thefts. The 78741 zip code had similar crime type reports, but less in number, and unlike 78704, were reported mainly on the thoroughfares like I-35, Ben White, Riverside, Oltorf and Pleasant Valley.
- Still looking for anyone else who is willing to patrol, and I have extra signs to put on their vehicle.
- To report items, the app for 311 is useful, as you can submit a picture.

Communication

- The newsletter is being resumed, with a pared-down version for the summer, to be distributed in late June.
- Several articles have been submitted already, those wanting to contribute will need to limit articles to 500 words.
- The newsletter chair has found a printer that is less costly.

Area Coordinators

- Area 2 AC Russell Fraser expressed concern about children crossing at Blunn Creek and Mary/Woodland. He presented images to illustrate the problem. A neighbor suggested approaching the school to request a crossing guard.
- Russell also expressed concern about the state of the sidewalk along Live Oak between Congress and Blunn Creek. He has interacted with parents pushing buggies in the street because there are steps at the corner of Live Oak and Eastside.

ANC (Austin Neighborhoods Council)

- Amy Boggan, of Capital Delivery Services (a new department in the city) presented on a survey regarding the 2026 General Obligation (GO) bond that we will vote on in 2026. The City is asking for citizens to give feedback on their survey at https://publicinput.com/s14056. The survey is available until June 23rd.
- ANC carefully followed (and lobbied against) a number of bills that would seriously affect our ability to protect our neighborhoods against rampant development. - Bill Bunch (head of Save Our Springs) presented information regarding the efforts of "Keep Mopac Local." The Zilker NA and Austin High are very opposed to projected changes to Mopac.
